The Center for Addiction Medicine (CAM)
Academy was developed to provide traumaresponsive addiction medicine education and
technical assistance across federal regions
seven and eight. The CAM Academy was
made possible by philanthropic donors and
federal grant funds, of which we are so
appreciative.

In 2023, we launched our first CAM Academy efforts. In total, we reached **660 PEOPLE** through training, presentations, and technical assistance efforts. Please see below for more detail regarding the offerings and the participants reached.

STANDARDIZED WORKSHOPS PROVIDED:

In August 2023, we started offering virtual training to Denver Health employees and people across the region. We conducted:


7 SESSIONS of the TRAUMA-RESPONSIVE CARE WORKSHOP:

This workshop, designed for all clinical and non-clinical healthcare providers and professionals, will cover key topics such as understanding trauma and the role of protective factors, the impact of an elevated stress response on our bodies, and the influence of racism and weathering on health disparities for people of color. Participants will also identify three techniques to create a trauma-responsive care environment, promoting a supportive and healing environment for both staff and the people we serve.

2 SESSIONS of the IMPACT WORKSHOP:


This workshop equips addiction medicine professionals with the skills to effectively treat adolescent substance use. It integrates Motivational Interviewing (MI), Acceptance Commitment Therapy (ACT), and Emotionally Focused Therapy (EFT). Through interactive exercises and case examples, participants learn to engage adolescents with substance use disorders and co-occurring conditions.

These workshops reached 129 PARTICIPANTS: 67% Denver Health staff and 33% external participants from FIVE STATES including California, Colorado, Tennessee, Utah, and Wyoming.




PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS:


PARTICIPANT'S EMPLOYMENT SETTING

EVALUATION DATA:

Evaluation data for the workshops were collected through Denver PTC's Learning Management System (LMS). CAM utilizes a modified Kirkpatrick ^[1] Evaluation model that measures satisfaction with the workshop, change in knowledge and skill, and intent to change. Participants were given the opportunity, via email, to complete the survey. The evaluation survey had a 56% response rate (n=72). **The evaluation results are presented below**.

LEVEL 2: CHANGE IN KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS

LEVEL 3: INTENT TO CHANGE

PRESENTATIONS PROVIDED:

26 PRESENTATIONS were conducted by subject matter experts related to Substance Use Disorders throughout 2023; these included topics on HCV and HIV related to substance use disorders, and much, much more! These presentations included a wide range of venues from Denver Health to national conferences.

In total, an estimated 530+ PARTICIPANTS were reached.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROVIDED:

CAM Academy provided a total of **6 HOURS** (1 hour per month) of technical assistance to a Colorado organization newly implementing virtual intensive outpatient treatment in Colorado.
